




The Heart of Winter by Jonathan Evison

After seventy years of marriage, Ruth and Abe's blissfully quiet life comes to a crisis when Ruth is hit with devastating medical news.




<u>Save Our Souls</u> <u>by Matther Pearl</u>


The Three Lives of Cate Kay by Kate Fagan


Water Moon by Samantha Yambao

Roman tax collector Catus Decianus underestimates the newly crowned Queen Boudicca of the Iceni tribe, causing the beginning of a rebellion.




<u>Yin Yang Love Song</u> by Lauren Kung Jessen


<u>Johnny Careless</u> by Kevin Wade



advice for her mom.




<u>A Forty Year Kiss</u> by Nickolas Butler


You Are Fatally Invited by Ande Pliego


<u>Dark Vector</u> <u>by Ward Larsen</u>


<u>The Quiet Librarian</u> by Allen Eskens

A quiet, middle-aged librarian must confront her unexpectedly dark past to save herself after her best friend is found murdered, and she believes she is next.




The Fourth Consort by Edward Ashton

The first human representative in a galactic confederation finds himself in a fight for survival against a new set of enemies in this darkly humorous sci-fi adventure.




Kate & Frida by Kim Fay


All the Other Mothers Hate Me by Sarah Harman


The Filling Station by Vanessa Miller


Good Soil by Jeff Chu


The Savage and Noble Death of Babs Dionne by Ron Currie

When a baby boy is found on a beach next to a small fishing village in 1970s Ireland, the local community takes him in and discovers the true meaning of family in this emotionally charged debut.




<u>The Ride</u> <u>by Kostya Kennedy</u>
