
# The Cottage Around the Corner by D.L. Soria


# <u>Borrowed Life of</u> <u>Frederick Fife</u> <u>by Anna Johnston</u>

## <u>Haunt Sweet Home</u> by Sarah Pinsker


After landing a job as a production assistant on a reality show, a young woman starts to experience unsettling events in real life, leading her to question everything-even herself.

A young man finds a book from a secret parallel universe. His discovery leads to a journey filled with magic and murder that could save, or destroy, both versions of post-World War II London.




# A Home for the Holidays by Taylor Hahn


# <u>Last Gifts of the</u> <u>Universe</u> by August Riley


### <u>Pearly Everlasting</u> by Tammy Armstrong

Pearly and a bear named Bruno were raised as brother and sister in a remote logging camp during the Great Depression. How far will Pearly go to protect him?




### <u>President's Lawyer</u> <u>by Lawrence Robbins</u>

A high-stakes legal thriller following a Washington, DC, litigator who is hired to defend his best friend, the former President of the United States, against a murder charge.




# <u>The Paranormal Ranger</u> <u>by Stanley Milford</u>

A riveting historical novel that charts the comingof-age of a gifted but immature young naval officer as he is tested in the crucible of World War II in the Pacific.




#### <u>Libby Lost and Found</u> by Stephanie Booth


# The Improvisers by Nicole Glover

Go inside the flock and learn all the things that make chickens such remarkable creatures; from the author of *The Soul of an Octopus*.




# If I Stopped Haunting You by Colby Wilkens

An enemies-to-lovers romance with a spooky twist where two feuding authors end up on a writer's retreat at a haunted castle in Scotland.




# <u>Love in Bloom</u> by Lucy Eden

When Atlanta publicist Emma Walters inherits a farm-and its handsome but infuriating managerher new life in the country is anything but idyllic.




# <u>The Arizona Triangle</u> <u>by Sydney Graves</u>


### Magnificent Ruins by Nayantara Roy


### <u>Ghosts of Waikiki</u> by Jennifer K. Morita

Freelance biographer Maya is unwittingly drawn into a murder investigation when the controversial land developer who hired her turns up dead.




## <u>Ingrained</u> by Callum Robinson

From the author of This Is Happiness, a compassionate, life-affirming novel about the Christmas season that transforms a small Irish town.




# <u>Trouble Island</u> by Sharon Short

Winter, 1932. Two women living on a remote island harbor dark secrets that extend well beyond the icy waters of Lake Erie in this gripping debut novel.




# <u>I Might Be in Trouble</u> by Daniel Aleman
